



## Research and Notecards

1. Log into NoodleTools
2. Create a Project
3. In the "Dashboard", before adding sources or notecards, SHARE PROJECT...

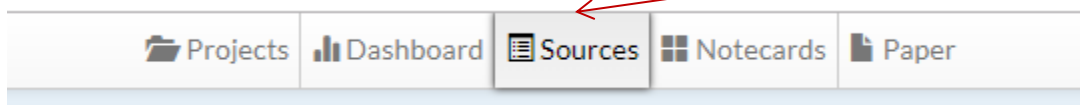

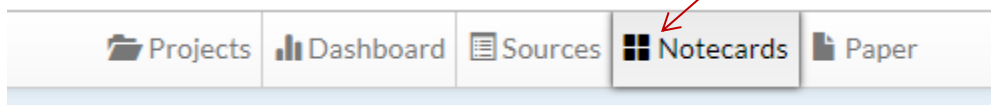

7. Once you find a source you will use, add the source to your project's "Sources" list.

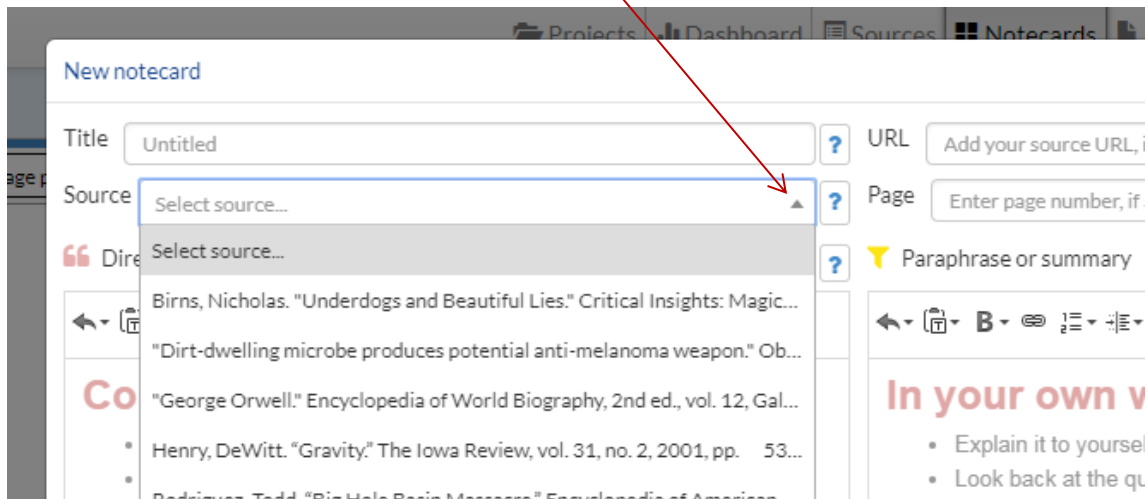


8. Remember to cut and paste the already-made citation from your database ([how-to here - page 8](#) from your MLA assignment) so you don't have to do more work than you have to.

9. Once you have sources in your project, when you create a notecard...



10. The sources will appear in the source drop-down list so you can associate your notes with the appropriate source.




11. The title of your source cards are given to you (Background, Pro, Con...).

12. The other info you will fill in as appropriate - and as explained by Mrs. Anderson.

13. Once you create a note card and save it - you are required to color-code the cards by topic for this assignment. **Background** cards will be **Blue**, **Pro-amendment** cards will be **Green**, **Con-amendment** cards will be **Red**.

To add **color** to one or more notecards:

1. First, select each of the notecards you wish to add or remove a color from.
2. Click the **Tags** menu above the Tabletop, select **Color** on the menu, and click on one of the six colors.
3. To remove or replace a color, select the color you want to remove, or select a different color.
