Evaluation: The article is useful to my research which regards how lighting adds meaning in film. It gives specific information on how viewers could fairly easily determine where the film was produced by looking at what "constituted natural lighting" (NY vs CA). The source quotes academics and has a bibliography for each section. The source appears objective, but only two geographical locations are used, so unbiased, but not broad. The goal of the source is to present a chronology of advances in cinematography in the 1960s.

Reflection: The source is very helpful to my research, it supported some assumptions I already had and presented new topics (like "natural" lighting on location shots was more costly than in a studio). New directions like this helped me to categorize my information
