### *Terms & Acronyms*

#### *Writing*

**Thesis or MT/Main Thesis:** Single sentence and the main focus for essay. It addresses the prompt, if provided, and makes a claim or argument (not merely a statement of fact). It must be able to be supported by evidence, not merely a statement of opinion.

**BTS/Body Thesis Statements:** The first sentence of your body paragraph/s. Makes an argumentative statement in support of your thesis and will be the point you are trying to prove with the evidence found in those paragraph/s.

#### *History Terms*

**Historical Concept (HC):** change, continuity, causation, consequence, significance, perspectives

**OPCVL: Origin, Purpose, Content, Value, Limitation.** A technique for analyzing documents.

#### *SHS Humanities Terms*

**Split Block & Block classes:** English and Social Studies SPLIT BLOCK classes are integrated curriculum taught in cohort groups by English and History teachers. English and Social Studies BLOCK classes are integrated curriculum team taught for two periods by English and History teachers.

**Integration – LA/SS:** Curriculum (content and assignments) with elements of both LA and SS. Integrated assignments will go in both the English gradebook and the History gradebook.

## ● IB Terms & Acronyms

**CAS: Creativity, Activity, Service.** This is the major ‘out of class’ requirement for IB students. Students complete a long-term project with at least 150 hours of documented activities in the areas of creativity, action and service and meet 8 learning outcomes. ([details](#))

**Command Terms** – the list of definitions supplied by IB that tell students what “define” and “analyze” means in different subjects.

**CP: Career Program.** A two-year program (11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade), students take IB and CTE and complete the IBCP Core requirements.

**DP: Diploma Program.** The final, two-year comprehensive program of six IB classes and the IBDP Core requirements, culminating in the IB Diploma.

**EE: Extended Essay.** A research paper of up to 4,000 words on a topic of interest to you in a subject you are/will study in the IB Program. This independent research is completed under guidance of a school employed supervisor of their choice. ([details](#))

**HL/SL: Higher Level/Standard Level.** HL courses are taught over two years and include a more in-depth and rigorous study of the course material. These courses allow students to explore areas of interest within the subject in greater depth when compared to SL.

**IA: Internal Assessment.** These refer to various assignments in each subject that are conducted during the course, assigned and evaluated by the teacher, and then a sample set is sent off to IB moderators to validate or modify the marks assigned by the classroom teachers. In history, for example, the IA is a research project on a topic of the student’s choice; in science, the IA is the documented record of the student’s lab work. An **IO (Individual Oral)** is an IA - just an oral recording rather than a paper submitted.

**EA: External Assessment.** These assessments are graded by IB examiners. External assessments include the written IB exams taken by the student at the end of a course. In some courses, including film, the external assessment is a textual analysis. In visual arts, studio work is assessed.

**ManageBac** Online school portal for managing IB submissions like the EE.

**Papers (1, 2, 3):** This is essentially an IB term for examination papers. Each subject takes at least 2 and sometimes 3 papers as part of the IB exam for that subject.

**PPS: Personal and Professional Skills.** This is the “capstone” course of the IB Career Program. This course focuses on skills, habits and knowledge students will employ in the career field the student has selected to pursue.

**TOK: Theory of Knowledge.** This is the “capstone” course of the IB program. While each classtouches on aspects of TOK, the actual course is taken in the senior year. Students complete a TOK presentation and TOK essay as part of the course.

*Additional IB terms for teachers:*

**IBIS** is the administrative page that allows for student registration and student work upload/eCoursework and **MyIB** is the teacher resource center for all things subject and policy related to instructing subject matter)

**PG: Predicted Grade.** This is an estimated grade requested of the teacher by IBO prior to the final submission of work/the exams. It is one more criteria by which IBO figures final marks for students. PG are often required for college admissions in non-US countries. SHS does NOT release PG directly to students.
