- Think of the short film you are writing like it's a montage film, like the montage "News on the March" at the beginning of *Citizen Kane*. <u>Here is the screenplay for that section</u>.
 - Start by circling items on your graphic organizer that could possibly be in your film.
 - Then maybe put the ideas in order by numbering them.
- Then open Celtx, and start writing your ideas in screenplay format (*remember*, *just what you can see or hear*).

- You may have a narrator, like in *Citizen Kane*.
 - look at the formatting for that, and ask for help if you need
- Or have the dialog and sounds be part of the film.
 - *Citizen Kane* does this too, but to a lesser extent
- Please do NOT think of it as a documentary
